Sub: Grant of Conditional Permission to “Om Ayurvedic College & Research Centre, Near Crystal World, Roorkee Haridwar NH-58, Vill.- Panchayanpur, PO-Daulatpur, Roorkee, Haridwar-249402, Uttarakhand” for admission with 30 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2020-under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970 in compliance of Order dated 10.03.2021 of Hon'ble High Court of Uttarakhand at Nainital in WPSB 122 of 2021- reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order no. L-14014/337/2020 EP-1 dated 15.02.2021 and dated 25.03.2021 vide which denial of permission was conveyed for the A.Y. 2020-21.

2. Further, refer to the representation of said college dated 26.03.2021 to Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) against the denial order dated 25.03.2021 passed by Ministry, in compliance of Order dated 01.03.2021 & 04.03.2021 of Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at Delhi in 2110/2021 & connected matters with W.P. (C) 1736/2021 and the CCIM's letter with ref. no. 3-4/2020-Ay. (40), dated 25/03/2021.

3. The reason for the college being not considered granting permission for 60 UG seats for the A.Y. 2020-21, due to the deficiencies related to (i) teaching faculties (15 eligible teachers are available against the minimum requirement of 30 eligible teachers and 04 Higher faculty in 04 departments are available against the minimum requirement of 15 Higher faculty in 14 departments as per RMS, 2016).


4. Now, in compliance of directives made by Hon'ble High Court of Uttarakhand, at Nanital in WPSB No. 122 of 2021 & considering CCIM decision dated 25.03.2021, following 12 Petitioner Teachers has been considered for granting conditional permission of said college:

In view of the above, now the said college is having total **27 faculties** {15 whom CCIM considered as a regular Teacher vide its letter dated 04.12.2020 and above mentioned 12 petitioner Teachers}. However, in spite of having 27 Teachers, college still not fulfills the minimum required criteria as per RMS, 2016 of having **12 Higher Faculty in 11 departments** for granting conditional permission for 60 UG seats as college possess only **09 Higher Faculty in 08 departments**.

6. Further, college has examined in terms of approved criteria and policies, exclusively relaxed for academic year 2020-21 for granting Permission for 30 seats in UG (BAMS) course and it is found that the college is **fulfilling relaxed criterion for granting permission for 30 UG seats** for the A.Y. 2020-21 i.e., **the college has 27 eligible teaching faculty (including 12 petitioner Teacher) against the minimum requirement of 21 eligible teachers as per the relaxed criteria for 30 seats in UG (BAMS) exclusively for the A.Y. 2020-21;**

7. Therefore considering the Interim order of Hon'ble High Court of Utrakhnad dated 10.03.2021 and CCIM's letter dated 25.03.2021, it has been decided by the Central Government to **grant Conditional Permission to Om Ayurvedic College & Research Centre, Near Crystal World, Roorkee Haridwar NH-58, Vill.- Panchayanpur, PO-Daulatpur, Roorkee, Haridwar-249402, Uttarakhand with 30 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2020-21 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, subject to the outcome of writ**



petition No.WPSB 122 of 2021 at Hon'ble High Court of Uttrakhand. The college is directed to inform the students that the permission to admit the students has been granted subject to the results of the above mentioned writ petitions pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Uttrakhand. Further, an undertaking from the students may also be taken that their admission are subject to the result of the writ petition.

8. The grant of Conditional Permission to **Om Ayurvedic College & Research Centre, Near Crystal World, Roorkee Haridwar NH-58, Vill.- Punchayanpur, PO-Daulatpur, Roorkee, Haridwar-249402, Uttarakhand** with 30 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2020-21 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, is also subject to the following:

- i. The fulfillment of conditions as specified in the Undertaking/Indemnity bond submitted by the college.
- ii. The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, nonteaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- iii. College needs to submit their compliance report to CCIM regarding fulfilling the required criteria for its actual permitted intake capacity for UG & PG as per IMCC, MSR, 2016 regulations except for Higher faculty for UG criteria only i.e., relaxation for Higher faculty will be considered if two Lower faculty are appointed in place of 1 Higher faculty of the concerned subject. The compliance report is to be submitted to CCIM within three months from date of issue of permission letter.
- iv. CCTV system along with live streaming to be installed in, one each at one of the classroom (lecture theatre), Pathology lab, OPD Registration with waiting area and the place where Biometric attendance is taken, with access to CCIM (as communicated vide Ministry's OM dated 02.03 .2020 to all ASU colleges).
- v. Implementation of Geo fencing for ensuring physical presence of Teaching faculty, Students and Hospital staff in the respective ASU College /hospital which is an up gradation of existing required criteria of Biometric Attendance as per 9(3) regulation of IMCC, MSR, 2016. (CCIM will issue detailed instructions in this regard)
- vi. Maintenance of Web based computerized central registration system for maintaining the records of patients as per regulation 3 of IMCC, MSR, 2016. (CCIM will issue detailed instructions in this regard)

9. It is further informed that minimum of **15% of undergraduate seats** of the permitted intake capacity of **30 UG seats shall be treated as all India quota**. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority of State/UT Government as designated by Central Government vide letter F.No.L.11011/02/2020-EP (1) dated 26.10.2020 for A.Y. 2020-21 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**



10. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.
11. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Board of Governors, CCIM and the Central Government.
12. As per clause 3(1)(a) of IMCC, MSR Regulations, 2016, the following requirements which are required to be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2020, will be examined for considering the permission for the session 2021-22:
- (i) All the Minimum Standards Requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - (ii) All the Requirements of "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard of Educations in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda college); and
 - (iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made there under should be fulfilled *in toto*.
13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to CCIM under intimation to this Ministry. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2021-22.
14. Ministry's earlier letters of even no. dated 15.02.2021 & 25.03.2021 may be treated as withdrawn. Accordingly, your representation dated 26.03.2021 to Grievance Redressal Committee against the denial order dated 25.03.2021 stands disposed off.
15. Further, the college has been provided 05 (Five) working days' time to admit the NEET-2020 qualified candidates from issuance of this letter. The admission process shall be completed through respective state Govt. counseling authority and only NEET-2020 qualified candidates, who are having eligibility for admission as per relevant CCIM regulations shall be considered for admission. This is a onetime measure and should not be treated as precedent.
16. This issues with the approval of Competent Authority.
